The next fifteen minutes was really a purple patch for Cross, our half back line of Danny O'Callaghan and Aaron Kernan were giving the forwards a great supply of the ball. A free by Aaron Kernan and two points from Oisin McConville, one from a free and one from play, put us in front for the first time. Then came the best score of the game when a great fetch by Oisin was transferred to Francis Hanratty who coolly side footed it to the net. Johnny Hanratty and David McKenna were controlling the mid field and perhaps we should have been further in front but we squandered a few opportunities. Our opponents hit back with a point from play, but Aaron Cunningham responded guickly with a similar score. The half ended with a point from Dromintee to leave the score Rangers 1-6 Dromintee 1-3.

The big talking point at the interval was whether Rangers 3 point advantage would be enough, playing against a strengthening wind. Well we certainly got our answer when Francie Bellew appeared in place of Mickey McNamee. It was not as if Mickey was playing badly, the move was purely tactical as it was anticipated that Dromintee would play a more direct game this half, and so it proved to be. On the resumption it was Rangers who dominated the first ten minutes but had nothing to show for it. A great attempt resulted with Aaron Cunningham striking the crossbar and we also spurned the chance of a couple of points. Then the visitors got their moment when they scored a good point from play. Once again it was the old head of Oisin McConville who restored the status quo with a well taken point from play. The next ten minutes belonged to our opponents and three points in a row, two from frees and one from play brought the sides level at 1-7 each. By this stage Martin Aherne



had replaced Stephen Finnegan while Kyle Carragher replaced Francis Hanratty. Kyle Carragher's substitution made an instant impact when, taking a good pass from Tony Kernan, he restored our advantage with a well taken point. However our opponents were not finished and a point from play left the sides level with seven minutes left to play. At this stage Paul Hearty's kickouts were outstanding finding a man each time. This was a critical time for the boys when questions were being asked of the commitment and how did they answer them. Two great points in a row from Kyle Carragher gave us breathing space and although our opponents threw everything at us our defence held firm. We then mounted another attack and Stephen Kernan finished the game off with a fine point from play to leave the final score Rangers 1-11 Dromintee 1-8.

This was a tough exciting game of football, not really one for the purist, but to win a championship you have to be up for the game, no matter what way it is played. It was a tough, hard game of football and great credit must go to both sides for the sporting manner in which it was played. Great credit must go to team managers Gareth O'Neill and Tony McEntee, they surely got it right on the day. A special word also to our trainer Seamie McGeown, who had the boys in great shape.
